Rosa Davison - Clifford Bay

Wednesday, May 18 9am - 11am

Rosa Davison started with 14 ha of dry, wind-swept grazing land bordered by the stony coastline of Clifford Bay. The soil was "solid clay" and there was no bush apart from a few ngaio, boxthorn and one cabbage tree. Eleven years later her 2 ha garden, just north of the Awatere River mouth, is an outstanding coastal sanctuary, a showcase for planting with natives in a tough environment.

Standout features are:

- Use of New Zealand natives in European-style formality such as hedges and topiary in pittosporum and hebe.
- Collection of rare and endangered New Zealand plants including pink broom, prostrate kowhai, Poor Knights' lily and southern rata.
- The limited palette of plants in mass plantings. Ngaio is a feature plant.
- Increase in birds and other wildlife as the plants and pond become established.
- Extensive use of mulch to build up soil and retain water.
- Limited spraying for early weed control (none for disease).
- The seamless transition from sea to shore to garden.

Rosa is a professional landscape gardener with a sound understanding of New Zealand natives and a passion for rare plants. She combines all these skills at her Clifford Bay property and has transformed the site with this inspirational project.

Directions

The field day will be at Rosa's property, 243 Renners Road. From Blenheim turn left off SH1 at Dashwood and follow Redwood Pass Road, then straight ahead on to Renners Road nearly to the coast. Allow 30 minutes from Blenheim.
